

This policy forms part of a framework of documents which govern LEW Techniques' trading and exporting of controlled military goods and technology, and other items relating to specific defence, security, or foreign policy concerns of the United Kingdom.

LEW Techniques exports goods and associated information outside of the UK which fulfil a variety of applications, and as such faces Export Controls imposed by the UK Government. These controls aim to prohibit the sale of technology that facilitates the manufacture of weapons of mass destruction (WMD) by other states, as well as tackle the direct and indirect support of terrorism and human rights abuses around the world. They are informed by a framework of UK and UN law, control lists, sanctions, and embargoes, including the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979, the Export Control Act 2002, and the Export Control Order 2008 as amended.

It is the policy of LEW Techniques to fully comply with these Export Controls and applicable legislation in order to support the Government in its commitments to non-proliferation and arms control. We acknowledge that failure to do so may result in criminal and financial penalties for the Company and provide training to relevant employees to ensure that the goods we provide meet licence requirements prior to shipping outside of the UK. As such, we may require our customers to provide information on the end-use of parts at any point during the sales and quoting process in order to comply with our legal obligations and promote an efficient and positive experience.

LEW Techniques also acknowledges that it is affected by international regulations and other local legislation by virtue of the location of our customers and the industries in which we operate. We will assist customers with their compliance in these areas upon request where applicable to the goods we provide.

This policy informs internal procedures managing our approach to Export Control and works in tandem with our Anti-Corruption and Bribery, Ethical and Whistleblowing Policies.
